A. NEW BUSINESS

1. Letter from Jonathan Kashimer of 6 Fenimore Avenue dated September 13, 2016.

As per the letter from Jonathan Kashimer of 6 Fenimore Avenue, he spoke to Dr. Daniel Camillery at 37 Hathaway Drive. Dr. Camillery, his wife Donna, and their two children live at the northern tip of Hathaway on the eastern side of the roadway. They request that some signs in the area be removed or moved. Please accept this as their formal request to have these signs removed and/or moved. Unfortunately, the two hour parking signs in front and to the rear of Dr. Camillery's house have had unintended consequences to Dr. Camillery. In addition to the signs being unsightly, tickets have been issued for visitors that have exceeded the two hour parking rule. Dr. Camillery had an embarrassing situation where his elderly parents received a ticket while visiting the family because they stayed for more than two hours. Prohibiting family from visiting for more than two hours was not the purpose of these signs.

Mr. Jonathan Kashimer who wrote this letter spoke to Maureen Traxler, President of the Western Property Owners' Association and e-mailed it to her. As per Mr. Kashimer, please place this issue on the Agenda for this meeting.

Recommendation: As per Jonathan M. Kashimer, this request was approved at their Western Property Owners' Association Meeting.

2. Formal Motion and Petition from Pat DiMattia dated September 14, 2016 – Stop Sign – Hilton Avenue and Third Street.

The Central Property Owners' Association recommends the installation of a four-way stop sign at the intersection of Hilton Avenue and Third Street. The motion was approved by a vote of ten (10) in favor with one (1) abstention. The motion was made after a public discussion regarding the traffic problems on Hilton Avenue and Third Street and at the direct request of a significant number of residents who attended our meeting. A petition in support of this request is attached and includes close to sixty signatures, primarily from Third Street residents and others from Hilton Avenue, Cedar Place and Fourth Street.

Memo from Commissioner Kenneth Jackson dated September 23, 2016 supporting the Central Property Owners' Association Request for All-Way Stop Signs at Hilton Avenue and Third Street.

The Police Department has reviewed the CPOA request for all-way stop signs at the intersection of Hilton Avenue and Third Street. Currently, there are stop signs east and west on Third Street.

Recommendation: This memo was sent to the Traffic Commission and the CPOA at Commissioner Jackson's request. The CPOA supports this request and approved it to be put on the Agenda.

Recommendation: Please add this Motion and Petition to the Agenda for this meeting as per the Central Property Owners' Association for a four-way stop sign at the intersection of Hilton Avenue and Third Street.

3. Letter and Petition from Aisling Bier of 21 Saint Paul's Place.

She and her neighbors are writing to you as concerned neighbors and parents in the area around the St. Paul's Place and Hampton Road intersection. They feel this intersection is dangerous, and that two additional stop signs should be added to make it an all-way stop. This intersection serves as two bus stops for Stratford and Hemlock Schools, and it's a common route to/from the High School and Old Country Road. Currently, there are two stop signs on Hampton Road stopping only the traffic travelling north-south between Merillon and Stratford Avenues. There are no stop signs on St. Paul's Place for traffic running east-west between Oxford Boulevard and St. Paul's Circle.

A response letter was sent to this resident and her letter was sent to the Estates Property Owners' Association for approval.

Pat DiMattia advised on October 12, 2016, **"The CPOA recommends the installation of a four-way stop sign at the intersection of Hampton Road and St. Paul's Place."**

Recommendation: The Estates Property Owners' Association approved a four-way stop sign at Hampton Road and St. Paul's Place at their meeting of October 12, 2016.

4. Letter from Deborah Long of 26 Cathedral Avenue.

Deborah Long of 26 Cathedral Avenue has resided at the corner of Third Street and Cathedral Avenue for 60 years. She wants to bring some attention to the number of accidents that occur on that corner on a regular basis. She asks for the Village to check the Police Records for that intersection because it seems there are more frequent and

serious accidents. She is hoping there is some remedy before more accidents occur as they are regretting not implementing either a sign, light or speed bump.

This letter was sent to the Central Property Owners' Association for their approval.

5. Two-Hour "NO PARKING" Signs on Kensington Road at the intersection of Merillon Avenue.

Request submitted by Paul and Mary Ann Rothenbiller, 216 Kensington Road.

Recommendation: A September 1, 2016, e-mail from Matthew Abruscii advised Mr. Rothenbiller – **"The Estates POA voted to support this"**. As per Doug Singer, The Estates Property Owners' Association approved the above-referenced request at their meeting of October 12, 2016.

6. STOP Signs on Wetherill Road at Mulberry Avenue Creating a 4-Way Stop.
Requests submitted by Sean Obrien, 9 Maple Street, Ken Hillman, 6 Maple Street and Domenico DeRosa, 72 Mulberry Avenue.

Accident data provided by Commissioner Jackson, Garden City Police Department.

Recommendation: As per Joe Moody, the Eastern Property Owners' Association consensus: **"Add Stop signs creating 4-Way Stop"**.

7. No U-TURN Sign at the Intersection of East Drive and Flower Road.

Request submitted by Frank Diamond, 18 East Drive.

Recommendation: As per Joe Moody, the Eastern Property Owners' Association consensus: **"Add No U-turn sign at East Drive. Ask about possible No Right turn – Except Local Traffic Sign on Clinton at Flower"**.

8. STOP Sign on Magnolia Street at Meadow Street Creating a 3 (ALL)-Way Stop.

Request submitted by Carolyne Green, 41 Meadow Street.

Accident data provided by Commissioner Jackson, Garden City Police Department.

Recommendation: As per Joe Moody, the Eastern Property Owners' Association consensus: **"Add Stop sign at Magnolia creating All-way Stop"**.

9. Pedestrian Crossing at Eastbound Chestnut Street and St. James Street So.
Request submitted by Teresa Bonelli, 114 Chestnut Street (east of Clinton Road).

Accident data provided by Commissioner Jackson, Garden City Police Department.

Recommendation: As per Joe Moody, the Eastern Property Owners' Association consensus: **"Add Pedestrian crossing sign at top of hill on westbound Chestnut. Eastbound signage found to be sufficient"**.

B. DEFERRED AGENDA

1. Letter of March 20, 2016 – Residents of Lindbergh Street.
Residents of Lindbergh Street are requesting a three-way stop sign at the intersection of Meadow Street and Lindbergh Street.

The EPOA did not endorse the addition of the stop signs.

DECISION: THE TRAFFIC COMMISSION AT THE JUNE 16, 2016 MEETING VOTED TO DEFER THIS REQUEST AND THE POLICE WILL SURVEY MEADOW STREET AND COMMANDER AVENUE IN SEPTEMBER WHEN SCHOOL IS IN SESSION.

Recommendation: As per memo dated October 14, 2016, from Inspector Michael J.
